

Baby Sock Cat Toys

Assembly Instructions

materials: (per toy)

1 baby or toddler sized sock

1/2 tsp. catnip

cotton batting

yarn or ribbon

Fill the sock, alternating batting and catnip up to the heel. Tightly tie off the sock with yarn or ribbon in a knot.

Assembly Instructions

materials: (per toy)

3 pipe cleaners

Cut 2 pipe cleaners in half, twist the four pieces together in the middle. Use the third pipe cleaner to wrap the twisted section to make a “body” for the spider. Bend each of the legs at an angle so the spider will stand on it’s own.
